We have reached the end of another school year. It always feels like it flies this time of year. I saw a quote the other day from Terry McMillan (who is a best-selling author) that said, "I pray for my children. That they stay safe and make good decisions. That they be happy, thoughtful, and caring human beings. That they have the strength to get up if they fall down". It made me start thinking about what kind of children we want our children to be. We have just finished Parent/Teacher conferences and for some of that time, we may have focused on academic readiness (especially for our Pre-K students). However, here at WEE school, we always want to make sure our children are not just academically ready for school but that they are socially and emotionally ready for that next step. That process does not begin just in pre-K or just in school. It is a process that begins so early in life. We do not

- even think about it sometimes. I think that kindergarten readiness really should focus more on the social-emotional readiness and less on the
- academic readiness. First children need to know themselves and have the confidence and emotional skills to be able to move into the next step in school. We can help our children get ready for that in several ways.
 - Encourage their own individual interests. If your child enjoys music, art or sports, I encourage you to find extra activities to cultivate that interest.
 - Use words like, you can't do that YET but if you keep practicing, it will get easier.
 - Praise your child's effort, not their outcome. Talk about how hard they worked on their art and ask them to tell you about it. Try hard not to say, "What is it" which I know can be hard. You can use words like, tell me about your picture.
 - Help your child compliment and be proud of themselves.



- Help your child know that being away from you is okay. We want them to feel confident when they are not with you and that you will also be okay.
 Reassure them that you will always be back.
- Encourage your child to try new things, maybe even together so you can show them that we never stop learning and growing.
- Help them label their emotions all of the time. This can seem monotonous but understanding their emotions can be so important in the next steps.
- We want our children to ask MANY questions and you should ask them
 questions too but try to make them as open ended as possible. If you ask
 only yes or no questions, that might be the only answers you get.
- Role-play situations. This can help them know how to handle difficult situations.
- Help your child become more empathetic. Talk about different situations and ask them how people might feel when that happens. Ask them how they could help that friend.
- Give your child lots of opportunities to work on cooperation. This can be in play, like building together, but can also be in responsibilities or chores at home. Work together to get the "to do" list done.
- Most important, be a good role model. How you interact with them, your significant other, your friends, family, they are watching. If you want them to ask for things nicely, model that to them. How you interact with your child is how they'll interact with others.

We know that our friends have grown and learned so much this year. Each of them have worked on different areas of development and have all made strides forward. We know that for some of our families, this will be "see you later". We don't want to say goodbye because the door is always open for visits and we hope you all keep in touch. We love hearing and seeing how all of our WEE graduates do in the future!

It was so great meeting with all of you during parent-teacher conferences and sharing all the progress your children have made. Thank you so much for the thoughtful gifts and delicious food during Teacher Appreciation Week!

Reminders for Warm Weather: Please provide a filled water bottle for your child each day. Please apply sunscreen in the mornings. If you would like us to reapply sunscreen later in the day, (especially for after care), please send in a permission slip and labeled sunscreen.

For the rest of May we will learn about space, the sun, moon, and the planets! This is always a favorite topic for Pre-K children. In June, we will focus on Types of Animals and Where Do Animals Live?

Pre-Reading and Reading: The Green Room class is ready for Kindergarten Reading lessons! We will be using a comprehension story, Sophie's Boat Ride, to introduce Story Elements and answer Who, What, Where, When and Why. We will also learn he Sequence of the Story, the Characters, Conflict and Resolution,

Math: We will continue to identify double digit numbers by using ten frames and tally marks. We will also work on simple addition and subtraction. Some children will use counters to help them solve simple equations, while others are ready to solve the equations using numbers.

While we can't believe that this is our final newsletter of our school year, we are grateful to have the rest of May, and part of June together, as we still have lots of fun learning left! We will be focusing on the vowels, their job in words, and reviewing the 2 sounds each make, as well as the "th", "sh", and "ch" sounds. We will also review the other letters over the next weeks, with recognition, sound, and formation. We will continue with our weekly/biweekly reader booklets as well. We will continue work with both rhyming words and opposites, as well as build simple 3 letter c-v-c (consonant/vowel/consonant) words (cat, bat, rat, sit, bit, pit, bed, red, fed...). We will review our patterns from throughout the year, continue recognizing/ordering #'s 0-20, counting by 5's, skip counting, and more than/less than. We will do simple measurement with rulers and connected links to practice length and height. We're hoping to play some board and/or card games to practice taking turns and good

"sportsmanship".

Our door tags will continue to be the phone numbers that you provided, and the children will work on recognition (and perhaps) memorization. In May, we began a new morning prayer, as well as a new prayer before snack and lunch. Our patriotic song is "God Bless America". We will continue learning about Baby Animals, Maryland, the USA, and summer!

We could not be prouder of your children... in their individual growth, their gained independence, and in all their accomplishments. They have gained confidence, curiosity, and determination. We have had so much fun learning in Science this year! Your children are amazing, natural scientists! They have observed, documented, guessed, hypothesized, and explored lots of things! We have experimented; some worked and some didn't. It was awesome when they worked, but it was still exciting when they didn't! We have seen and used different tools used by scientists (the 2's and 3'5 have become comfortable with pipettes, mixing and using lots of Science tools. We have used many of our vocabulary words in other appropriate situations (liquid for example, a friend asked if I would pour him some more liquid at snack). Pre-K has grown so much in their observation skills! They have become so amazingly proficient in documenting our experiments through drawing. When their Science journals come home in June, look at the growth from September to the end of school. They are seeing the big picture with great detail! I am so proud of them! They have worked so hard and it shows!

As we end the year we will be making Seed balls from homemade paper. We will catch bubbles and The Lego Lady will hopefully make an appearance!

All of the children have made connections to their every-growing world. My goal is always that they realize science is an exciting way to learn things about the world around them and that sometimes things work and sometimes they do not. We just keep trying to figure it out. also hope that the children have grown in the confidence that there are very few problems that we cannot solve or at least manage if we just take a breath and think for a minute. We have also learned the mantra if we make a mess.... We can clean it up. And your children of all ages can clean up a spill themselves! It has been my joy to share my time with your children in science! They always remind me that God is amazing, and his creation is remarkable and often mind-blowing. To see the world through their excited eyes makes life so much fun! Please take time to look through their eyes, even when it is sometimes inconvenient. They are building their perspective of being a person by watching you. Do you literally stop and smell the roses? Do you unplug and turn bath time into a science experiment, a car ride into an adventure in the environment, cooking into research for the new thing I might like to try to eat. A mess into an opportunity to solve a problem and have the family work together as a team?


