Dear Families,

We have already begun our second month of school- that's crazy to think about! The children have done a fantastic job of getting accustomed to our school routines and structure. We are seeing friendships form and the children are starting to share so much with their teachers. Their personalities are really starting to shine. Some of our friends will take a little longer to adjust (especially our part time friends) and that is okay too. We often like to use the word, yet. They aren't there yet, but they will be and sometimes watching that moment of transition or learning something new, is the best part of our day!

You can help your child be successful at school by encouraging them to try things at home. This will be different for each child. Some may be working on putting on shoes independently. Others may be potty training. We want to encourage you to take the time to let your child attempt to do this for themselves. We know that as adults, we are often hurrying from one thing to the next, but it is incredibly important for the child to be included and involved in what is happening. This is how they learn best-by doing. If they have trouble, tell them it's okay, remind them there are things that you can't do yet or that are hard for you but that you keep trying. Take time to celebrate successes when they do things independently as well. While the process takes time, it is so rewarding to see their smiles when they have successes.

As we begin October, we have already felt a change in weather. We are loving the cooler temperatures and more outside time. Remember that it can still be cold in the morning and very warm at times in the afternoon. Layers are often the best solution during this transitional weather. Be sure to check the extra clothes in your child's backpack or cubby so that they are appropriate for the season.

Fall is a wonderful time to explore the areas around us. The Baltimore area has many fun places that can be enjoyed as a family. We encourage you to take walks outside and look for signs of fall. It is fun to visit a local farm and go apple picking or choose your pumpkin together if your family carves one for Halloween. We have attached some local farms that you could visit. Green Room

Hello Parents,

The Green Room friends did a terrific job during the month of September. We really enjoyed getting to know each other, making new friends, and for some of us, getting reacquainted with friends from last year. The children have become familiar with the daily routine, schedule, and classroom rules.

Social/Emotional Development: In Pre-K, it can be exciting to be more independent and have more responsibilities, but it also takes some getting used to and adjusting. Just within these first few weeks, the children have become independent with many skills. Parents are often pleasantly surprised by what their children can do independently. Here are a few examples: putting belongings in their cubbies, putting on and zipping their jackets, putting their fitted sheets on their cots, packing up their rest/nap belongings, putting on their shoes, and later in the year, tying their shoes.

Fostering and encouraging age-appropriate independence helps build confidence and self-esteem. Young children show excitement and pride as they master a new independent skill. We have seen this excitement recently as the children have learned to make up their cot or pack up their belongings all by themselves. One of the best gifts we can give our children is showing them that we believe they can do things independently and give them opportunities to try new skills. Will the children do these skills perfectly or the way we prefer them to be done? Probably not, but the important thing is that the children are learning how to be independent one step at a time, and we are preparing them for the real world.

We have also been giving the children many opportunities to write with a pencil and cut with scissors independently. We have found that using small, golf pencils are really helpful for pre-k writing. You may want to use golf pencils at home! In addition, practicing cutting at home (with a child's pair of scissors) would be a great idea. Children enjoy cutting up old magazines or old wrapping paper. Please feel free to ask us how a child should hold a pencil or scissors.



Green Room

Recently we have been introducing the children to the concept of "personal space" or a "personal bubble". Respecting someone's personal space can often help solve conflicts quickly. We have also been working on listening to the teacher and following directions right away. The Green Room friends are doing a great job listening so far!

During the month of October, we will be focusing on the following themes: Community Helpers and Fire Prevention, Farm Life, and the Season of Fall/Autumn.

In Pre-K, we do not go in alphabetical order when working on the letters. We follow a curriculum based on writing the letters. So, we start with the letters that are the easiest to write and gradually progress to more challenging letters. In October, we will focus on letters: Ii, Ff, Ee, and Hh. The children will learn the sounds and how to write the letters.

For Math, the children will be focusing on: patterns, putting items in the correct sequence or order, putting numbers in order, and counting 1 through 20.

Happy October Purple Room Families! September was a very busy month (which seemed to fly by), as we all got used to being together, becoming friends, and learning the routine. The children worked very hard, acclimated very well to becoming Pre-K 4 students, classmates, and friends.

We worked on letters LI, Tt, and Ii, learning the sound each makes, the proper way to form it, coloring pictures that begin with that sound, hearing poems that exposed us to lots of words that begin that way, as well as giving tracing them ourselves a try. We focused on the numbers 0, 1, & D, as well as making different AB patterns. The children learned to recognize their first names written on many different things in the classroom, did lots of creative/imaginative play during morning and center time, learned new finger plays, poems, prayers, and songs. We began to enjoy our specials each week (art, music, science, & Dible) and especially enjoyed our new playgrounds! We learned a lot about being a kind friend, apples, and began learning about fall/autumn.

During October we will continue to focus on more letters. By emphasizing the beginning sounds of words, it helps your child make the connection, and can become a game! We are learning that letters make words, words make sentences, and sentences make stories & Dooks. We spend a little time each day enjoying a book to ourselves as we transition from snack to our special. We are learning how to treat books respectfully, track from left to right, look for letter we might recognize, and become engaged on our own... even it we can't read the words quite yet.

Our letter this month are Ff, Ee, Hh, Vv, and hopefully Ww. We will enjoy studying fall/autumn, pumpkins, leaves, fire safety, and possibly community helpers. We will begin practicing tracing our first names with only a capital letter at the beginning and the rest lower case. When practicing at home, please encourage this (capital initial letter – rest lower case), and check for a pincher grip when they are using a crayon, marker, pencil, etc. It takes practice for this to become comfortable and able to apply an adequate amount of pressure. Tip: the shorter the pencil (think a golf pencil), the better it is to maintain the pincher grip. Thank you for entrusting us each day with your child. They are



such a precious gift who make us laugh each day and continually bring smiles to our faces... as well as keep us on our toes.

I strive to help the all the children know: It is fun to explore, observe and guess! It is amazing to see change and wonder what made it happen. It is fun to sometimes almost know why it happened. And it is a wonderful thing to have fun learning!!

It is ok to make a mess, but we all have to help clean them up.... with a good attitude. It is ok for something not to work, and we can learn lots from these events. I can work with a partner and we can do it well. We can have conversations that help us as we explore and observe and guess (3's and 4's). I can document in my journal what we did, what we used and what I saw (4's). I can document what we did by describing it.

We are going to be studying liquids, gas and solids in October and then we will have some fun with magnets.

Play together lots, laugh together, and hug!

Music with Ms. Claire

The children are having so much fun learning songs about September and the beginning of Fall/ Autumn. We had fun singing with numbers, the alphabet, and movement. We used scarves to dance, flags to march to Patriotic songs and seasonal props to enrich the songs of Fall. In October, we will continue songs of Fall as well as Halloween. Each month we will focus on a specific patriotic song and celebrating any holiday. Why do we teach Music? There are so many skills that are taught during this time: listening, following directions, and learning vocabulary (language); learning rhythm (sensory); improve coordination (physical); and increase memory (intellectual).
