

February- the month of love. January was definitely full of changes in routines as we recovered from the holidays, had a few snow days and there were definitely some illnesses to overcome. I know we are all looking forward to more routine days ahead. Although raising and teaching young children, sometimes it's hard to know what routine is. As soon as we figure it out, they change in their development a little and we re-route and figure out the new normal.

As we head into February, we often think of love and how we show that to others. It seems even more important as we look at the world around us to want to educate this next generation on how to show love and caring to their families, friends and communities in which we live. I think it's important that we start at a young age sharing there are so many ways of showing love. We often think of how we show that in our families and marriages first. However, we want our children to know how to care and love for those around us.

February is one of the months that Woodbrook Baptist Church collects items for ACTC (Assistance Center of Towson Churches). There is more information in the newsletter to follow on what specific items they are focusing on. However, I think what would be very tangible for our students is having them help go to the grocery store and purchase the items to help others. Talk to your child about how there are people in our communities that need our help to have food. Sometimes this seems

like a heavy topic but I think it can help children begin to appreciate the things that they have and that we as a community can help those around us.



February is also Black History Month. At WEE, each of our classrooms will spend time learning about important contributions and sacrifices of Black Americans who have helped shape our country. We want children to see and acknowledge these gifts and struggles that many had to go through to share their gifts and to be appreciated by others.

We also have worked to expand our school library to include many books that provide "mirrors and windows" to the world around us. "Mirrors" in books allow us to see ourselves in the book while "windows" in books allow us to look into the lives of those that are different from us. It's important that children have both of these in their lives. We often select books that are comfortable or have cartoon characters that our children like. While any reading is great for our children, I encourage you to look at your home libraries or books you check out from the public library and try something new. At bedtime reading, maybe read a favorite and a new book.

Happy New Year to the Red Room Families. We hope everyone had a great holiday season. We have had a great start to the new year. In January, we started off by talking about the new year. We looked at the numbers 2024 and talked about how it changed to 2025. We talked about how to keep our body healthy by exercising and eating healthy. Each month, we love to learn a new song about the month. In January, we sang:

> "January, January, Happy New Year, Happy New Year, Icicles and Snowflakes, Eskimos and Snowman, Winter is Here. Winter is here."

It was great that we got to see icicles and snowflakes in January. It is fun to see a snow day through the eyes of a child. In January, we got to talk about the winter weather that was happening outside, what animals do in the winter, colors, and opposites. It was great to talk about the seasons, what we wear in the winter, and any changes we see in the winter. Some animals love the cold weather while other animals like warmer weather. We talked about animals that hibernate, migrate, and camouflage into their environment. It was neat to learn big words like hibernate, migrate and camouflage. It is interesting to learn about animals that love winter like penguins and polar bears. We concluded the month of January talking about colors, and being introduced to opposites. We read books, did art projects and completed science experiments to see how primary colors can mix together to make secondary colors. In February, we will start off learning about shapes. It is exciting to learning about the shapes all around us in the world. Then we will do a Valentine's Day theme. We will understand what Valentine's Day is and how we can show love to the people around us.



The Green Room friends have had a great start to the New Year! We have been very busy learning about the season of winter and how animals adjust to this season. We have learned about three concepts: hibernation, migration and adaptation. It's impressive how well the children have understood these challenging words and concepts! We also learned about Martin Luther King and how he led people to live in peace and respect others.

Moving into February...

The themes for the month of February will be: Ground Hog Day, God's Love and Friendship/ Valentine's Day, Black History, 100th Day of School, and Planets and Space. We will learn about Jesus' miracles and how God cares for us and how to treat others. During the theme of Black History, we will introduce the children to famous Black Americans and their contributions to society. During the space unit, we will learn about the sun, the moon, and each of the planets.

February Skills and Developments:

The Green Room friends will be working on a 100th Day project this month. More information coming soon!

We will start to introduce sight words. Sight words are words that are read frequently and do not need to be sounded out, for example: the, I, and, have, at, you, are, me, etc. Along with the sight words, the children will be introduced to sentence structure.

We will also begin using Little Readers. Little Readers are simple stories using sight words. The children will take a reader home each week or so, and can practice reading the sight words at home.

The math skills will be: AABC patterns, the teen numbers, ordinal numbers, making comparisons, simple addition, and making sets of 10.

Happy February Purple Room Families! The month of January really flew by... not to mention 5 whole months of school! Everyone has grown so much, not only in size, but in skill and their social/emotional development. We are very proud of their individual accomplishments. We've enjoyed learning about winter, Martin Luther King, Jr., and hibernation, migration, adaptation of different animals. We will finish January learning about the Lunar New Year, hibernating our bears (another fun pajama day), and beginning to explore Arctic animals. We will begin to officially work on sight words. This is mainly for exposure. Some children will "get them", and others may take longer; both are okay! We will learn about Groundhog Day, dental health, Valentine's Day, and (hopefully) space. Additionally, we will create another classroom book, starring your children as the authors and illustrators!

We will celebrate Valentine's Day with a class party on Friday, February 14th . A sign-up will be posted outside of the classroom (by the sign-in/out sheet) soon. We will exchange Valentine's cards as well. We have 13 total children in the Purple Room. Please leave the envelopes BLANK for easier distribution. 
